# **Reflection** *FROM FR. JAKE*May 24, 2024

Dear Friends of St. Lawrence Newman Center,

"In this world, you will have trouble, but take heart, I have overcome the world." John 16:33

What does it mean to "take heart"?

"The heart," the Catechism of the Catholic Church 2563 says, "is the dwelling place where I am, where I live— our hidden center, beyond the grasp of our reason and others. The heart is the place of decision, deeper than our psychic drives. It is the place of truth, where we choose life or death. It is the place of encounter."

In the Biblical sense, our heart is all of our past choices, good and bad, what we trust most, and what we most desire. We are currently writing the story of our life, and our heart is where all the writing is found. A priest professor of mine in seminary would say: "By the mere fact that we were born we were born writers! The ink we use to write is our choice, so be careful what you write!"

And yet, if I have learned one thing in the Christian life, it is that I cannot always "trust my heart" since I have an uncanny ability to go astray. This is what we call *concupiscence*—a capacity for disordered desire or inclination. Everyone has this (unfortunately) and it only muddles the waters of our life, actions, and hearts. Perhaps the best definition of humility I have heard is this: humility is a progressive distrust of self and a progressive trust in God.

To "take heart" I think we could do no better than to practice the art of taking heart; not so much in our own hearts, but in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It is a fitting time to think about this since the Month of May is traditionally the month of Mary (and her Immaculate Heart) and the month of June is the month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

While the secular culture invites us to take security in defining ourselves according to our sexual desires and self-imposed hedonistic self-gratification, the Sacred Heart of Jesus invites us to "come to me, all you who are weary and heavy-burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me for I am meek and humble of heart."

I invite you to "take heart" in the hearts of Jesus and Mary these days. What are a few ways we can do this?

- Come to Holy Mass on the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday, June 7, and the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Saturday, June 8.
- Pray daily in the months of May and June the litanies of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- Take into your daily meditation that you are resting your head upon
  the heart of Jesus and/or the heart of Mary. Allow your whole person
  to rest in this most secure of all places. Slowly read a short passage of
  Scripture and repeat this several times slowly. Tell the Lord of your
  desires. Repent of your sins. Do everything in the Peace of Christ.
- Pray and make reparation for the sins and outrages against the heart of Jesus by which He is greatly offended.

May we "take heart" in the stability of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
